Why do Presbyterian churches have an empty cross? (*Jesus is alive*)

In Presbyterian churches, why is the communion table never referred to as an altar? (*The altar was where sacrifices were made; we believe Jesus Christ paid the final sacrifice*)

How do we worship? Name at least 3 ways. (*Prayer, song, meditation, reading scripture, living our lives in obedience to Christ.*)

How do you "join" the church? (*Baptism: when someone is baptized, infant or adult, they are baptized into the fellowship (membership) of the church.*)

What two sacraments are celebrated by Presbyterians? (*Baptism and the Lord's Supper*)

What do the bread and juice in Communion signify? (*The body and blood of Christ.*)

What does the water in Baptism signify? (*Life and cleansing*)

What are some of the responsibilities of being a Christian?

Who wrote the Book of Acts? (*Luke*)

What kind of information is found in Acts? (*The birth and history of the early church.*)

Who wrote most of the letters in the New Testament? (*Paul*)

Why do we study the Bible? (*To know God.*)

Why do we go to church? (*To worship God in community with other Christians.*)

Name 2 of the first 5 books of the Old Testament which are commonly referred to as the Law? (*Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers, Deuteronomy*)

What is your favorite Bible verse and why?

How many books are in the Bible? (*66*)

How many books are in the Old Testament? (*39*)

How many books are in the New Testament? (*27*)

What is the meaning of "Christ"? (*Messiah/Savior*)

Name 2 things that Jesus did in his ministry. (*Teach, preach, heal, perform miracles: water into wine, sight given to blind, raised someone from the dead, enabled a crippled man to walk...*)

In Galatians 5:22-23 there is a list of the nine "Fruits of the Spirit," nine things that become part of a Christian's personality because of the influence of the Holy Spirit. What are 3 of them? (*Love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control.*)

Which of the above "fruits" is one of your gifts? Which ones are you working on?

The name of our denomination is (*Presbyterian Church, USA*)

In some Christian Churches, church leaders are appointed by bishops. In the Presbyterian Church, USA church leaders are by the people. (*Elected*)

The governing body of the local congregation is called the (*Session*)

Members of this governing body are called (*Elders*)

Name three forms of church government and identify the one that we use. 1. *Monarchy – a single person rules – Pope, the Bishop (Roman Catholic, Episcopal, Methodist.* 2. *Democracy - the people rule (Congregationalists, Baptist)* 3. *Representative Democracy - leaders elected by the people rule (only Presbyterians)*
